## **Section 1 - Compatibility**

### **1.1 Compatibility with Integrator database created by previous versions**

The Integrator database structure has changed. After installing this version, when you will be notified that the database must be upgraded when you open a connection. The upgrade will be automatic.

## **Section 2 - Documentation**

### **2.1 Documentation**

Event 1 is in the process of developing help topics for each area of the product. At this time, help buttons appear in each window. Only some lead to a help topic at this time. Because the help topics are HTML pages on the Event 1 website, new topics will become available to you as they are posted (without the need to install a new version of the software).

## Section 3 - Software Changes

### 3.1 Email Features

In older versions of the software, MAPI (Mail Application Programming Interface) was used to send email when the software was run unattended. This required that a MAPI compliant email client (such as Outlook) was installed and configured. Due to increased security measures in Microsoft applications to prevent worm viruses, Integrator now uses SMTP (Simple Mail Transfer Protocol) to send email. Because SMTP does not require email client software to be installed, you must provide email account properties to use this feature.

To specify the required properties, start Integrator and select “Tools / Email Account”. The properties that are required are:

- Your Name
- Email Address
- User Name
- Password
- Outgoing Server
- Port Number

If you are uncertain of the values that are required for these fields, your system administrator or email provider should be able to provide them.

### 3.2 Company Interface

#### 3.2.1 Switch first and last names

This option is only available when sending company information from Timberline to Prolog. When this box is checked, Integrator switches the first and last names so that the first name appears first and the last name is at the end. This will be done by locating the semi-colon separator that would separate the first and last names in Timberline. If no semi-colon is found in the name, no action is taken.

#### 3.2.2 Exchange insurance information

This checkbox enables or disables the exchange of insurance information. The default action in prior versions was to exchange insurance information by default. If you need to continue exchanging insurance information you must check this box.

### 3.3 Extras Interface

This is an optional interface that may be licensed separately. In prior versions, when an Extra was created in the Timberline database, the “Tracking Extras” flag on the related Job record was not updated. This has been corrected.

### 3.4 Cost Interface

Beginning with this version, cost information can be based on either actual cost information (JC Transactions) or billed cost data (BL WIP records). A new setting has been added to the [Files] tab under “Settings / Cost Settings”.

The options that are available are:

- JC Cost Transactions
- BL WIP Records (Billed Amount)
